The only letter that was any way negative was one from N3ED who, I feel, misunderstood the concept and thought that operators were going to be assigned to the operations. Of course that was never the intent; the service would only be referring people who had expressed an interest in operating in the particular type of operation planned. The organizers would then, at their option, contact the prospective operators and go from there.

With the interest shown, I think it would be appropriate to proceed with setting up the system. The first step will be to initiate registration of prospective operators. To this end I have created a questionnaire put together from my own ideas as well as the input from the calls, letters, and local radio clubs. TOPPING OUT: Let's face it, when we get to the top of a tower project, we look at the mast pipe and think "Gee, if I put up the antenna a few feet up from the mast, it will be higher, and that's better." Or we want a 40-meter beam "up top," or monobanders eight feet apart. So how high is safe?

The mast pipe can only take so much stress, which for the common iron water pipe normally used is 30,000 psi or, for less common aluminum (6061-T6 alloy) pipe is 38,000 psi, before it will bend. How much force is that? For a mast sticking up out of a tower top an applicable formula is: S=FL/Z where f=force in pounds, s=the stress, L=the length in inches, and Z=the section modules. This section module (Z) is different depending on the diameter of the pipe. For the pipes we normally end up with there are thick wall (schedule 80) and thin wall (normal or schedule 40) and the respective section modules Z for each is: for 1-1/2 inch pipe, schedule 80=.4118 and schedule 40=.3262, for 1-1/4 inch pipe schedule 80=.2913 and schedule 40=.2346. As you can see, thicker walls help and larger diameters help even more.

With the above, let's assume a "normal" situation; one that lets us work through the equations. We have a tower with room for a 2-inch diameter mast, for which we are using 1-1/2" (1.9 inches outside diameter) galvanized water pipe—the normal schedule 40 (about 1/8-inch wall) pipe, because it's easy to find, and heck, it's iron, it must be strong. Also, let's assume we have a "typical" tribander that is about 8 square feet in area. At 70.7 aph wind velocity the force is 20 pounds per square foot, at 86.6 aph it is 30, at 100 aph it is 40. Around here the guidelines are to design to 100 aph, and if we reach maximum allowed stress there (or above there) we will have a safety factor of two at 70.7 aph. Finally, let's assume we want to mount the antenna 3 feet above the tower apex. The force on the antenna is then (at 100 aph) 40 pounds per square foot times 8 square feet, or 320 pounds. The length of the mast (i) is 36 inches and z=.3262. For these values, the stress on the mast is:

\$=(320) (36)/.3262=35,315 psi

As you can see, this exceeds the 30,000 allowed on the iron pipe, but is all right for the aluminum. Mote that for the schedule 80 iron pipe (Z=.4118) the stress would be 27,974 psi, and would be acceptable. Note also, that for two antennas, you can make this calculation for each, add the stress, and see where you stand. So, go find some large-diameter thick mast and calculate what you can stack. A final aside...stainless pipe will have a yield stress of 150,000 to 180,000 psi, which would support a bunch; somebody find some cheap--please!!!

BY-LAWS

MEMBERSHIP: Applications for membership shall be submitted in writing on forms I. provided by the secretary. Each applicant shall express a willingness to abide by the Constitution, By-Laws, and other rules promulgated by the club. Two-thirds of the Full Members must approve the application before membership is granted. Membership shall be in four classes with requirements as follows:

A. ASSOCIATE MEMBER:

- 1. All requirements above.
- 2. Valid Amateur Radio license and membership in the ARRL.
- 3. Payment of dues as assessed by the By-Laws.
- 4. Permanent residence within 175 miles of Cedar Rapids, Iowa.
- 5. Attendance at 50% of the club meetings.
- 6. Must upgrade to full membership in two years from the time of joining the club.

B. FULL MEMBER:

- 1. All requirements of an Associate Member.
- 2. Possession of at least 100 QSLS from 100 different countries in accordance with a current ARRL DXCC countries list or possession of an ARRL DXCC Award. This requirement may be met either with a current call sign or a previous call sign, or a combination of both.

INACTIVE MEMBER:

- 1. Must be or have been an Associate of Full member in good standing.
- 2. If a member fails to maintain full or associate membership he/she automatically becomes an inactive member.
- 3. Inactive membership status may be maintained indefinitely by payment of the regular yearly dues.
- Inactive membership status allows all EIDXA privileges except that he may not vote or participate in contest for club aggregate scoring. He/she will receive notice of the club meetings, the newsletter and be eligible for club promotions.

D. HONORARY MEMBER:

- 1. In recognition of special service to the EIDXA or the DX community, an Honorary membership may be awarded to any individual.
- A two-thirds vote of the full members is required for Honorary membership.
- 3. An Honorary member receives a membership certificate and can use the club logo or club name to identify himself as a club member.
- An Honorary member does not pay club dues, does not receive the club newsletter and is not eligible to vote or participate in contest aggregate scoring.

E. MAINTENANCE OF MEMBERSHIP:

Failure to continue to meet all requirements for a particular membership class constitutes nonmembership status. Specifically:

- 1. ARRL membership and valid license.

2. Payment of dues by December 1st.

- LI. MEETINGS: Regular meetings shall be held quarterly, normally during the months of January, April, July, and October at a time and place as ordered by the President. Special meetings may be called by the Executive Committee (consisting of the Pres., V.P., Sec/Treas.) provided a reasonable effort is made to notify all members.
 - 1. The meetings are chaired by the President or other ranking club officer in his absence.
 - 2. The election of officers shall be held during the October meeting.
- III. DUES: A regular yearly assessment of \$4.00 per member is hereby assessed in accordance with Article V of the Constitution for the purpose of providing operating funds for current expenses. The EIDXA year runs from October 1st of one year to September 30th of the following year. Dues must be received by December 1st to maintain membership status.

IV. OFFICERS:

- 1. New officers take office at the end of the October meeting.
- 2. The Executive Committee may authorize emergency expenditure of club funds to \$15.00. Approval of a majority of the membership is required for emergency expenditures above that level as well as for all routine expenditures.
- 3. Emergency expenditures are reported by Secretary-Treasurer at the next regular club meeting.
- 4. The Vice President is editor-in-chief of the EIDXA newsletter.
- V. NEWSLETTER: The EIDXA newsletter shall be published quarterly two weeks prior to the club meeting and shall serve as formal notification of the forthcoming meeting.
