I have been off the air since Dec., except for a stint in the ARRL DX CW contest, 80m/40m only. Did fairly well for no amp and low inverted vees at my in-laws place! But I'm closer to getting on the air...tonight I put up some wires for 40 and 20. Still have to get the feedlines into the house and run 110V to the desk, but maybe this week...

We moved into a new house about June 1, and have really been busy getting settled. The yard is once again a small one, a 70'x 120' lot. However, I'm optimistic about putting up the tower and beam. Should be a good location...from 28 ft. on the roof tonight I could see for miles in virtually any direction. I'll probably go with the THSDX again, maybe a half-sloper on 40, and try shunt feeding the tower on 80/160m. I have a feeling it'll be fail at best before it's all up. I am considering a Butternut vertical to get me by until then, but not sure a vertical is worth \$100 to me. I guess it would probably work well on 80/40, though.

Say hi to all. Congrats to all the guys on their SBDXCC's! If anyone is travelling through the area, give a shout. I monitor 147.600 simplex (the MVDXCC freq.) and the 146.67 repeater here regularly.

Tidbits....

The repeater has been trouble free this summer. Thanks to Bob, W4NIM and Al, K0VM the machine is working better than ever. In addition to paying the repeater electric bill, Bob is also maintaining the RTTY bulletin board along with Joe, W0MJK. The RBBS has new software which makes it more user friendly thanks to Joe's software additions.

There are several new users on the RTTY 2 meter bulletin board, N8OH, K0JGH, W0EJ, W0SR, K0FZ, and W0VX. Dave, W0VX, has been typing in the highlights of the QRZ DX bulletin which makes interesting reading weekly. Dale, W0IZ, sporadically puts up the WWV prop forecasts on the system too.

HF RTTY is really challenging. W0IZ and myself, W0WP, have really enjoyed the DX chasing this summer. It seems it takes a little better propagation than a CW qso requires, but even so weak signal QSOs are very common. Some of the summer catches include HV, XT, 9V, A4, 9H, HZ, 9M, F6 and many more good dx goodies. There has even been Chinese activity on RTTY!

Roger, N4RR, is back on the airwaves. He has his 204BA and his 5 el 15 meter yagi installed at 70 foot. He has been worked on the 145.19 repeater recently with his two meter array and 10 watts. He is looking into a new two meter amplifier to make it into the machine regularly.

Our Iowa City connection has whispered to us that Dave, N0AFL will have a new Henry amplifier in line very soon. Dave's old amplifier then makes its way to K0GVB's shack and most probably will be used heavily on 160 meters by Gary. With the advent of the the 160 meter high power operators, it is getting to be more competitive and extra tough for the 100 watt operators to make DX QSOs. Lets face it it is hard to find 10 db of antenna gain to compensate for the fellow down the block running a KW!

K0CF, has just purchased a new computer. Craig is looking for a couple of people to share the purchase of 10,000 mailing labels. The labels are 5/16 by 5 inches the cost is \$70.00 per box. This size is just right for filling up the report box on the EIDX QSL cards. Any help?

Some of the members are busy with antenna projects. W0SHL, Doug, has purchased the KT34XA. Doug should have it nearly all installed by the club meeting.

W0WP has installed a 402BA at 70 foot (Roger's old one). Gayle, W0FD, has ordered the new Discoverer 40 meter beam. He will pick it up at the CVARC Hamfest so it should be going up very soon afterwards. Gary, K0GVB, purchased a new windmill tower recently. He plans on putting up some interesting antennas! K0CQ, Jeff, completed a new antenna tuner over the summer months. Right now Jeff's antennas are all close to 50 ohms but with the new tuner you can be on some long wire arrays for the low bands from him. Jeff has a forrest in his back yard with plenty of potential antenna supports!

W0W is Keith (K0JSY). Keith is the newest Extra Class EIDXer! Keith hopes that new callsign gives him that extra edge in the DX pile ups. Keith has his 20 and 40 meter arrays in line again ready for another year of contest fever. Congratulations on the new license Keith!

N8OH, Jack, has his RTTY running smoothly. He recently added a new monitor to his latchup and is enjoying HF and two meter RTTY as well as press SWling with his little yaesu 757.

Russian Regional QSL Bureau...

Dear fellow ham operators.

The addresses of all Soviet local QSL bureaus that you find here have never been published before for a variety of reasons. This is the first major breakthrough. All information is current and was received through a reliable source in the USSR.

Oblasts (districts) are listed by their numbers (of 'R-100-o' award). Corresponding amateur region number and first letter of the suffix are indicated.

If oblast is non-existent, you'll find a dash in place of the address.

When writing in English, please add the following to each address:

Radiotekhnicheskaya Shkola DOSAAF, QSL burd (#) (i.e. Radiotechnical School DOSAAF, qsl bureau).

Addresses in Russian are also included. They are complete, you do not have to add (#).

A few words on 'what is what':

(prosect -avenue), (ulitsa-street), (pereulok-lane),
(proezd-passage), (shosse-highway), (bulvar-boulevard),
(naberezhnaya-embankment).

When sending a letter "do not" enclose IRCs or currency - it is not permitted by the Soviet authorities.

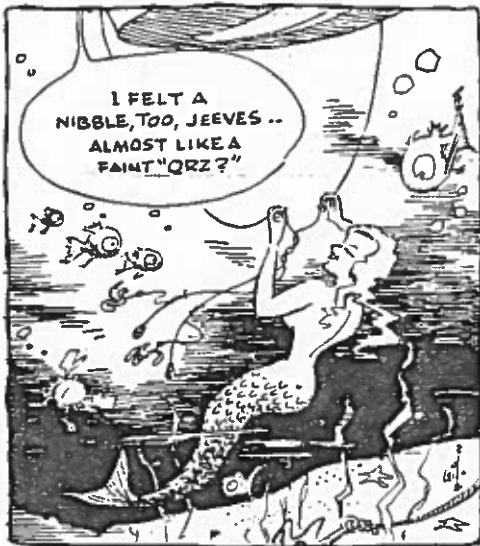

Because the summer DX activity was slow and the resulting DX Wantlist updates have been slow in coming in, the deadline for updates for the next DX Wantlist has been extended until the October 12 ZIDXA meeting. If you haven't given me your updates, please do so by then. Note that of those who were fed for no updates last time, all but one are in danger of being dropped this next time.

There seems to be a general decrease of interest in the DX Wantlist. Hopefully, with the onset of fall and the approach of winter, our DXing activities will pick up and interest and use of the DX Wantlist will follow suit.

If, however, there is really a general lack of interest in the DX Wantlist, maybe the future of the DX Wantlist should be re-evaluated. The present policy of automatically dropping those who do not update their listings was designed to weed out the casual DXers on the list and, at the same time, stir renewed interest in those of us really interested in working a new one. To a certain extent this policy has been successful, but now it appears that those participating in the DX Wantlist will be substantially reduced.

Some participants report giving one ringers to those needing a country only to find that the "needee" was too busy to be bothered to get on the air. Needless to say, after a few unsuccessful attempts to alert a "needee" to a new one, no more one ringers to that person are attempted.

Is the DX Wantlist a tool whose usefulness has passed? Does the DX Wantlist need to be modified to make it more useful to those using it? Make it smaller? Or bigger? Include more information or less? Or should it be overhauled completely? One suggestion from one of the users was to take a poll of the users and include only the top 100 wanted countries in the list. Should the DX Wantlist just be allowed to die a peaceful death?

Think it over and let's discuss it at the next meeting.
