ARRL BULLETINS

HR PROPAGATION FORECAST BULLETIN NR 52 FROM ARRL HEADQUARTERS NEWINGTON CT DECEMBER 31, 1985 TO ALL RADIO AMATEURS BT

THROUGH DECEMBER 24, THE SOLAR FLUX WAS HIGHER THAN ON THE CORRESPONDING DAY ON THE PREVIOUS SOLAR ROTATION 18 TIMES, AN ODD STATE OF AFFAIRS IN THE LATE YEARS OF A SOLAR CYCLE. BUT THEN CAME A 70, THREE 69S AND A 68, EACH 2 POINTS LOWER THAN THE PREVIOUS SOLAR ROTATION. STILL, THE DECEMBER FLUX AVERAGE WILL BE ABOVE 75, BEATING ALL OF THE EARLIER MONTHS OF 1985. THESE STATISTICS ARE CITED TO SHOW THAT SUNSPOT CYCLES, LIKE BASEBALL GAMES, ARE NEVER OVER UNTIL THEY ARE OVER.

WITHIN THE PAST TWO WEEKS, SOLAR ACTIVITY HAS COVERED A RANGE FROM ABOUT THE HIGHEST TO THE LOWEST THAT WE ARE LIKELY TO SEE FOR AT LEAST ANOTHER YEAR. FLUX READINGS IN THE 80S, AND THERE WERE 7 OF THEM BETWEEN DECEMBER 12 AND 20, CAN WORK WONDERS FOR 14, 21, 24 AND 28 MHZ, IF THEY COME DURING THE COOLER MONTHS OF 1986. THE LOW 70S AND HIGH 60S SHIFTS THE DX POTENTIAL TO THE LOWER BANDS.

THE NEW YEAR WILL START IN THE LATTER RANGE, BUT A GRADUAL RISE SHOULD BEGIN ABOUT JANUARY 2 AND CONTINUE THROUGH AT LEAST THE 6TH. THE EARTH'S MAGNETIC FIELD SHOULD BE RELATIVELY QUIET EARLY IN THIS PERIOD, MAKING FOR GENERALLY GOOD PROPAGATION ON ALL FREQUENCIES. AS THE FLUX RISES, GEOMAGNETIC ACTIVITY INCREASES AS WELL. THIS WILL BRING LOWER SIGNAL LEVELS AND INCREASED FADING JANUARY 7 AND LATER. THERE WILL BE A BRIEF RESPITE, AND MOSTLY GOOD CONDITIONS, JANUARY 11 TO 13. COMBINED WITH THE FLUX PEAK EXPECTED AT THIS TIME, THIS MAY BRING THE BEST 21, 24 AND 28 MHZ PROPAGATION OF THE MONTH.

A LONGER CALM PERIOD EXPECTED JANUARY 18 THROUGH 23 SHOULD PROVIDE GOOD PROPAGATION, BUT WITH LOWER MUF. THE POOREST PROPAGATION OF THE MONTH, ESPECIALLY IN THE HIGHER LATITUDES, IS LIKELY AROUND JANUARY 10, 16 AND 25.

AMERICAN SUNSPOT NUMBERS FOR DECEMBER 19 THROUGH 25 WERE BETWEEN 0 AND 11 WITH A MEAN OF 3.1 AR

HR ARRL BULLETIN NR 110 FROM ARRL HEADQUARTERS NEWINGTON CT DECEMBER 24, 1985 TO ALL RADIO AMATEURS BT

RADIO AMATEURS COMMUNICATING WITH THEIR CONGRESSMEN ALLEGING THAT A CERTAIN LOBBY IS OUT TO KILL PHONE PATCHES MAY BE DOING MORE HARM THAN GOOD. THE BILLS IN QUESTION, HR 3378 AND S 1667, HAVE BEEN NAMED THE ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS PRIVACY ACT OF 1985. THE BILLS INDEED REQUIRE SOME ATTENTION FROM THE AMATEUR COMMUNITY, BUT THEY DO NOT PROPOSE TO OUTLAW PHONE PATCHES. THE MEASURE CANNOT REACH THE HOUSE OR THE SENATE FOR A VOTE BEFORE FEBRUARY OR LATER, AND ARRL HAS BEEN WORKING CLOSELY AND PERSONALLY WITH COMMITTEE STAFF OVER THE PAST FEW MONTHS TO SMOOTH OUT ROUGH SPOTS. RADIO AMATEURS WHO WISH TO WRITE TO THEIR REPRESENTATIVES IN CONGRESS ARE ENCOURAGED TO FIRST OBTAIN A COPY OF THE PROPOSED LEGISLATION. COPIES ARE AVAILABLE FROM ARRL INFORMATION SERVICES, NEWINGTON, CT 06111. A LARGE SASE WITH 73 CENTS POSTAGE WOULD BE APPRECIATED. DETAILS IN JANUARY AND FEBRUARY QST AR

A special plaque will be awarded by CQ to the first amateur to qualify, as determined by postmark. Sequential numbers beginning with number one will be assigned to the WAZ-50 certificates in the order in which the applications are received by W4KA. Regular WAZ application forms will be used and are available from W4KA and from CQ Magazine, 76 North Broadway, Hicksville, NY 11801. SASE please. All standard WAZ rules apply except that the award application fee is \$5.00 for all applicants, regardless of whether the applicant is a CQ subscriber.

RTTY RBBS...TO BE OR NOT TO BE

On August 1, 1985, the two meter RTTY RBBS (Radio Bulletin Board System) was moved to the W0MJN QTH from W4NIM's QTH. In the first few months after the move, activity picked up from what it had been and system utilization was quite good. However, during the last month of operation, activity has begun to dwindle. The number of system accesses has dropped from 6-7 per day to 2-3 per day, and the number of "regular" users of the RBBS has dropped to about five.

As I have noted in past newsletters, the RBBS is only useful if it has a lot of different people putting information on it. I know there are a number of EIDX members that have RTTY capability, but are not using the RTTY RBBS. This fact, coupled with the recent low utilization would indicate that there is not enough interest in the EIDX to support an RTTY RBBS. The current lack of interest in the RBBS makes it difficult to justify tying up a computer, monitor, two disk drives, real time clock, computer interface, 2-meter transceiver, 12vdc power supply, and antenna on a full time basis.

I would like to keep the RBBS on the air, but if interest does not pick up during the next 4-6 weeks, the system will be taken off the air and the equipment put to better use.

MEETING MINUTES

The regular meeting of the Eastern Iowa DX Association was called to order by president Tom White, KOVZR, on September 20, 1985 at 7:43 PM at the Linn County REC Building.

Those present were WOEJ, KOVZR, KJOH, KEQY, KUOA, WOPPF, KFOZ, KBOPR, KORW, KOJGH, NCOO, WOIZ, WOMP, KOGVB, KAOCEH, KA2DZI, N9BD, WOVX, WOFD, KCOQ, NBOH, KOIIR, WOMJN, NGOW, and KOCF.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. Due to the absence of the secretary/treasurer, there was no treasurer's report.

OLD BUSINESS

Dayton Hamvention Transportation - NBOH reported that a bus could be chartered to provide round trip transportation to the hamvention for about \$50 per person. Local transportation in Dayton was discussed. A show of hands of those present indicated that about 12-13 were interested. Using vans was also discussed. NBOH will also look into group housing for next year.

Muscatine Hamfest - KEQY reported that this new hamfest will be held October 6 at the West Liberty Fairgrounds. Tickets are \$3 in advance and \$4 at the door. Flea Market tables cost \$5 plus \$2 for electricity.

QSLs - KOCF reported that orders are being taken for lots of 1000 cards at a cost of \$28 per 1000. Cut off for the orders will be Wednesday, September 25.

New Member Applications - Applications were received from Tom Hise, NCOO, for Associate Membership and Clark Pantel, KOIIR, for Full Membership. Both applications were approved.

It was announced that dues were being accepted for the 1985-1986 year. Also ARRL membership can be renewed through the club.

WOEJ reported that activity on the HQT 100 was off dramatically. More than half of the participants from 6 months ago have been dropped due to lack of activity. It was questioned whether the HQT 100 should continue.

DXAC Report - WOSR was not present, but it was reported that Pribiloffs still count for KL7!

RBBS - WOMJN reported that the RBBS has been moved to his QTH for various reasons. Activity, however, was up to the point that it was necessary to reblock the disk every 4 days.

Sunday Nite Net - The net still meets at 9:30 PM local time on Sundays. Because attendance was low, KOVZR questioned whether another night might be more convenient. This question was put off until the next meeting.

Repeater Status - W4NIN reports that the VSWR has stayed at 1.3:1 for the last 14 months.

KOLUZ sends greetings to the club via WOMP.

WOIZ pointed out that N9BD has put on several VHF/UHF grid squares with 2 meter Expeditions to Charles City and Spirit Lake Iowa and into Minnesota. The rare grid squares provided by Joe were EN33, EN23, and EN24.

New Business

KOGVB has IRCs for sale at \$0.35 each or 10/\$3.50.

KOIIR the Official Bulletin Manager for Iowa is looking for Official Bulletin Stations.

Fall and Winter Contests - What to do? Should there be more challenges? Should they be inter or intra club? KAOCEH volunteered to provide a trophy for whatever competition was selected. WOMP moved that the club make a strong effort on the CQ WW contests to evaluate the score and determine what course we should take for the ARRL DX Competition in 1986. WOVX seconded the motion. The motion passed. WOVX moved that we have a pizza party and a special edition of the newsletter to get everyone ready. The motion passed.

Membership Recruitment - Members were asked to make a pitch at their local clubs about membership in the EIDX.

Election of Officers

WOVX and KOVZR were nominated for president. KOVZR was elected.

WOVX was nominated for vice president and nominations were closed before Dave could protest. WOVX was elected.

KOGT was nominated for secretary/treasurer. Because Gary was not present to defend himself, nominations were closed. KOGT was elected.

KOVZR brought up several topics for future meeting programs which included FOOXX slides, packet radio, and KOGVB wanderings. Tom also suggested that maybe two programs for each meeting might be of interest: a DX program and a general/educational program. The January 1986 meeting would feature such a format. Ideas on how to streamline the business meeting were also solicited.

NGOW reminded everyone that he is available to check QSL cards for most CQ awards.

The meeting adjourned at 9:13 PM.
