For our April meeting we will be the guests of the High Frequency Communications Division (HFCD) of Rockwell's Collins Defence Communications (CDC) group. ((see next column)) Our program will include a tour of BF connercial station INT and the Collins museum. Included will be a look at how the professional operators use propagation prediction and conditions to communicate and a look at some "REALLYBIG" BF rigs and antennas. The station is used in connercial service and as backup to various government networks. The tour will be conducted by Heinz Blankenhagen, HROX, Conn Central Hanager.

Since the station is inside of a secure facility, there are several rules that we as guests must follow. All club members are on the visitor list and will be asked to sign in when they arive. (Rockwell employees should bring your employee badges so you can help escort the visitors.) When you sign in you will be given an escort required visitor's badge. While you are in the facility the badge must be worn and visible and you must be escorted by a regular Rockwell employee at all times. You will not be permitted to bring in radios (including HTs), cameras, or tape recorders. Brief cases, purses and packages will be searched going in and comming out of the building. These rules are necessitated by government security regulations so please follow them.

No provisions have been made to have non-members attend this meeting. Building access has been arranged for current members only. If you have a potential EIDXA member that you want to bring to the meeting please contact WGVX well in advance of the meeting to see if it can be arranged.



HR PROPAGATION FORECAST BULLETIN NR 12 FROM ARRL HEADQUART NEWINGTON CT MARCH 23, 1987
TO ALL RADIO AMATEURS BT

FROM FEBRUARY 24 THROUGH MARCH 21 THE DAILY SOLAR FLUX NUMBERS WERE HIGHER THAN FOR THE CORRESPONDING DAYS IN THE PREVIOUS SOLAR ROTATION, ON ALL BUT THREE DAYS. UNLESS SOLAR ACTIVITY DROPS SHARPLY IN LATE MARCH, THE MONTHS AVERAGE IS GOING TO BE WELL ABOVE THOSE FOR JAUHARY AND FEBRUARY.

THE IMPROVEMENT IS NOT SPECTACULAR, IN ITSELF, BUT IT GAVE THOUSANDS OF HOVICE AND TECHNICIAN CLASS LICENSEES A ROYAL WELCOME TO THEIR NEW OPERATING TERRITORY BETWEEN 28.3 AND 28.5 MHZ OVER THE PAST WEEKEND. CONTINUED INTERSIVE USE IN COMING MONTHS WILL HELP TO KEEP THIS BAND MORE INTERESTING FOR ALL OF US, INCLUDING THE AUTHOR OF THESE LINES, WHO MADE HIS FIRST APPEARANCE ON 28 MHZ MORE THAN 50 YEARS AGO AND STILL FINDS IT ONE OF OUR MORE REWARDING HOLDINGS IN THE RADIO COMMUNICATION SPECTRUM.

THE SOLAR FLUX TREND IS TOWARD HIGHER DAILT NUMBERS. THOUGH THE RISE IS SLOW THUS FAR, EVERY MONTH SINCE LAST OCTOBER HAS BEEN ABOVE THE FOUR QUIET NONTHS OF LAST SUMBER, WHICH STILL LOOKED LIKE THE LOWEST TERRITORY WE WILL ENCOUNTER FOR THE HEXT DECADE AT LEAST.

FOR THE CONING WEEK, AND PROBABLY THROUGH THE REST OF MARCH, THE SUN SEEMS TO BE HEADED FOR HIGHER FLUX HUMBERS, THOUGH PROBABLY HOT ABOVE THE MIDDLE 70S. WE WERE IN A MILD GEOMAGNETIC DISTURBANCE OVER THE PAST WEEKEND, BUT MORE STABLE CONDITIONS ARE EXPECTED UNTIL EARLY APRIL, WHEN MINOR DISTURBANCES ARE LIKELY. MORE ON THIS NEXT WEEK.

#### USE OF THE REPEATER ISSUES

There has been discussion and complaint about the use of the repeater. The net and DX spotting and mutual assistance should generally be considered to have priority on a DX repeater. There have been complaints that ragchewing has made this difficult, and those using the repeater tend to be too quick on the draw (or too longwinded) making breaking in difficult or impossible for lengthy periods. DX, when announced, is often announced too briefly (if you are under the cans working DX elsewhere), and those making the reports disappear too often when those who heard only part of what they said would like a repeat or more information about something they would like to work.

Several members have deserted the repeater for these and other reasons. Perhaps this matter should be discussed at the next meeting (time permitting) or those of you with feelings on the matter could write up your ideas and send them to the editor (Jan Clute, IFOZ, 320 College Blvd., Mt. Vernon, IA 52314) for discussion here.

TOYX outlined the format proposed for 1987 EIDXA meetings:

- 1. 7 PM to 7:38 PM scheduled as a social period.
- 2. Beeting to be called to order at 7:30 with a technical session lasting approximately 30 minutes innediately following the introduction of attendees and the sec/tres report.
- 3. Business meeting.
- 4. Break.
- Program with orientation towards DI and/or contests.

Hembers and visitors introduced themselves.

ABOH introduced the speaker for the technical session, Mr. Henry Hoffart, who presented a very informative talk on lightning characteristics and methods to protect electrical equipment from hits, including systems of grounding. A brief question and answer session followed.

The business meeting opened at 8:05 p.m.

The minutes of the fall meeting, having been published in the winter newsletter were moved accepted with no deletions or additions by NOSH, seconded by VOEJ, and passed by voice vote.

The Treasurer reported a balance of \$325.10, including \$81.00 repeater fund, as of the start of the winter EIDIA meeting.

987X showed an ARRL 50 year DXCC sticker and presented quantity pricing.

Two members expressed interest in purchasing the stickers in quantities of 1,000. This quantity was not feasible.

WORDER presented a report of the Repeater Committee describing the condition of the repeater PA (shown at the meeting) and describing the need for a new unit. The corrent status of the repeater fund was reported as \$41 collected at the last meeting plus \$40 received through the mail, giving a total of \$81. EDVM made an offer of \$69 for the old amplifier (as is). It was moved by WAMIM and seconded by WOEJ that the amplifier be deeded to EDVM as a token of appreciation for services, above and beyond,

in keeping the WOMJH maching functioning. Approval was unanimous. The hat was passed and \$265 was collected giving the repeater fund a total of \$355. WOMJH will order a Mirage B1015 amplifier to put on-line.

WOEJ reported on the Contest Connittee, outlinging following contest activities and club conpetitions:

- 1. ARRL DICC Golden Jubilee Award: NUOP had prepared a chart listing all club members and having spaces for members to write in their current DICC country count (1987) at each meeting. Stickers in increments of 25 countries will be given qualifying members by contest counitteemen WOVP and NUOP.
- 2. <u>lova QSO Party</u>: VOEJ moved that the EIDXA sponsor an award to the lowa club with the highest total score. After discussion, MBOH moved to table the notion. Hove to table carried.
- 3. ARRL DI Contests (Phone & CV): The division of the club membership into 5 teams for thee combined contests was explained and supplemented with a handout from the committee. Team captains were encouraged to have strategy meetings for their members and to drum up interest. Later MOSM presented charts showing how with the use of band-country multipliers, a respectable score could be accomplished with minimal effort. It was noved by WOEJ and seconded by KZOC, to approve this proposed team competition for the two upcoming ARRL contests. Motion passed by voice vote.
- 4. Hoved by WOEJ, seconded by MBOH, that EIDXA have 2 additional informal meetings per year, one of which could be the post-contest pizza critique. Motion passed by voice vote.

A short discussion was held relative to the need to clean the meeting room. The president requested volunteers to perform duties.
