For our April meeting we will be the guests of the High Frequency Communications Division (HPCD) of Rockwell's Collins Defence Communications (CDC) group.

Our program will include a tour of HF commercial station KHT and the Collins museum. Included will be a look at how the professional operators use propagation prediction and conditions to communicate and a look at some "REALLYBIG" HF rigs and antennas. The station is used in commercial service and as backup to various government networks. The tour will be conducted by Heinz Blankenhagen, NROX, Com Central Manager.

Since the station is inside of a secure facility, there are several rules that we as guests must follow. All club members are on the visitor list and will be asked to sign in when they arrive. (Rockwell employees should bring your employee badges so you can help escort the visitors.) When you sign in you will be given an escort required visitor's badge. While you are in the facility the badge must be worn and visible and you must be escorted by a regular Rockwell employee at all times. You will not be permitted to bring in radios (including HTs), cameras, or tape recorders. Brief cases, purses and packages will be searched going in and coming out of the building. These rules are necessitated by government security regulations so please follow them.

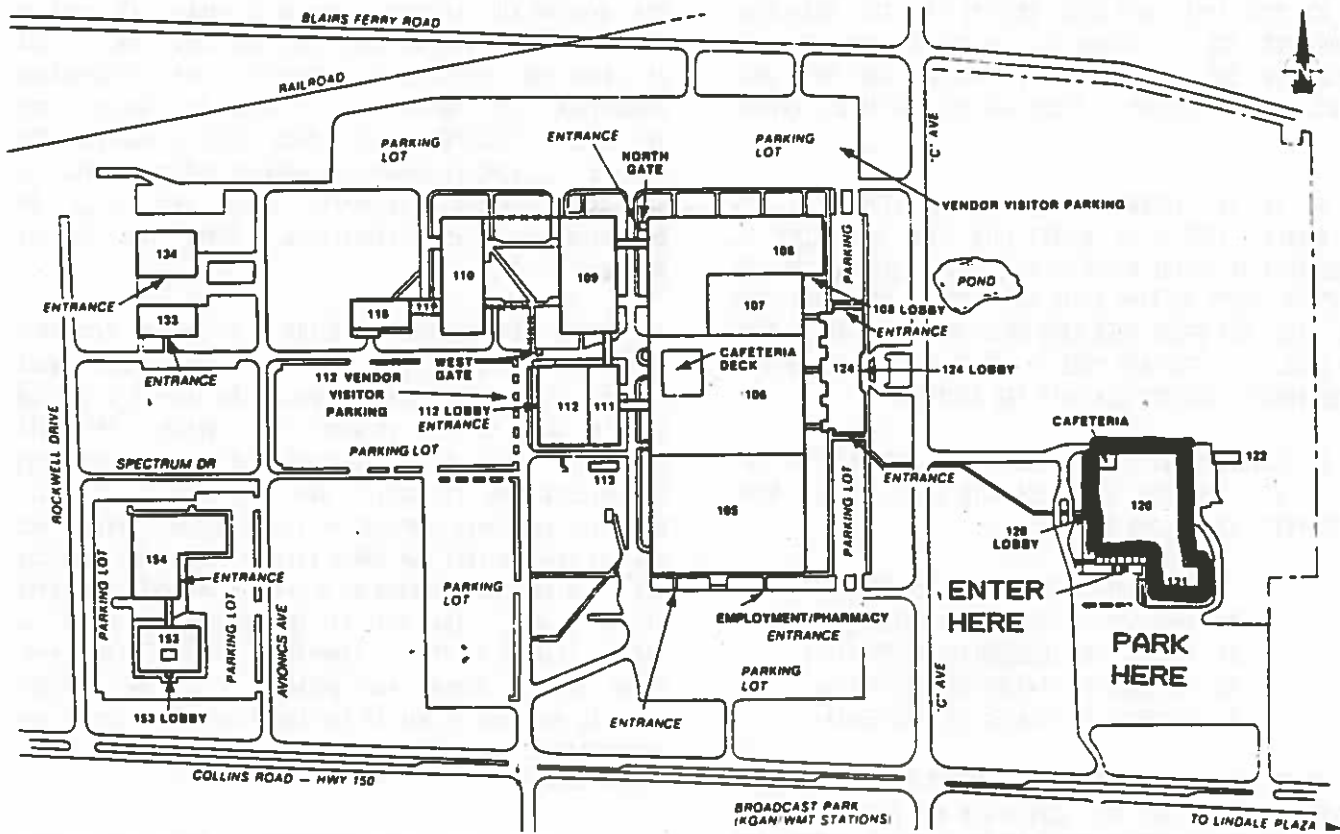

Also, please note that CDC has instituted a no smoking policy in all of its buildings. Smoking is not permitted in the building except in the designated areas. The cafeteria where we will hold the business meeting has a smoking area near the coffee and snack vending machines.

The actual program will start at 7:30 with the business meeting following the tour / demo. Building 120 is south of the antenna farm. Park in the large lot south of the building as shown on the map. HR PROPAGATION FORECAST BULLETIN NR 12 FROM ARRL HEADQUARTERS
 NEWINGTON CT MARCH 23, 1987
 TO ALL RADIO AMATEURS BT

FROM FEBRUARY 24 THROUGH MARCH 21 THE DAILY SOLAR FLUX NUMBERS WERE HIGHER THAN FOR THE CORRESPONDING DAYS IN THE PREVIOUS SOLAR ROTATION, ON ALL BUT THREE DAYS. UNLESS SOLAR ACTIVITY DROPS SHARPLY IN LATE MARCH, THE MONTHS AVERAGE IS GOING TO BE WELL ABOVE THOSE FOR JANUARY AND FEBRUARY.

THE IMPROVEMENT IS NOT SPECTACULAR, IN ITSELF, BUT IT GAVE THOUSANDS OF NOVICE AND TECHNICIAN CLASS LICENSEES A ROYAL WELCOME TO THEIR NEW OPERATING TERRITORY BETWEEN 28.3 AND 28.5 MHZ OVER THE PAST WEEKEND. CONTINUED INTENSIVE USE IN COMING MONTHS WILL HELP TO KEEP THIS BAND MORE INTERESTING FOR ALL OF US, INCLUDING THE AUTHOR OF THESE LINES, WHO MADE HIS FIRST APPEARANCE ON 28 MHZ MORE THAN 50 YEARS AGO AND STILL FINDS IT ONE OF OUR MORE REWARDING HOLDINGS IN THE RADIO COMMUNICATION SPECTRUM.

THE SOLAR FLUX TREND IS TOWARD HIGHER DAILY NUMBERS. THOUGH THE RISE IS SLOW THUS FAR, EVERY MONTH SINCE LAST OCTOBER HAS BEEN ABOVE THE FOUR QUIET MONTHS OF LAST SUMMER, WHICH STILL LOOKED LIKE THE LOWEST TERRITORY WE WILL ENCOUNTER FOR THE NEXT DECADE AT LEAST.

FOR THE COMING WEEK, AND PROBABLY THROUGH THE REST OF MARCH, THE SUN SEEMS TO BE HEADED FOR HIGHER FLUX NUMBERS, THOUGH PROBABLY NOT ABOVE THE MIDDLE 70S. WE WERE IN A MILD GEOMAGNETIC DISTURBANCE OVER THE PAST WEEKEND, BUT MORE STABLE CONDITIONS ARE EXPECTED UNTIL EARLY APRIL, WHEN MINOR DISTURBANCES ARE LIKELY. MORE ON THIS NEXT WEEK.

USE OF THE REPEATER ISSUES

There has been discussion and complaint about the use of the repeater. The net and DX spotting and mutual assistance should generally be considered to have priority on a DX repeater. There have been complaints that ragchewing has made this difficult, and those using the repeater tend to be too quick on the draw (or too long-winded) making breaking in difficult or impossible for lengthy periods. DX, when announced, is often announced too briefly (if you are under the cans working DX elsewhere), and those making the reports disappear too often when those who heard only part of what they said would like a repeat or more information about something they would like to work.

Several members have deserted the repeater for these and other reasons. Perhaps this matter should be discussed at the next meeting (time permitting) or those of you with feelings on the matter could write up your ideas and send them to the editor (Jan Clute, KF0Z, 320 College Blvd., Mt. Vernon, IA 52314) for discussion here.

January Meeting Notes

The meeting was called to order by the President, W0VX, Dave Jaska at 7:30 p.m. following a scheduled 30 minute eyeball social period.

W0VX outlined the format proposed for 1987 EIDX meetings:

1. 7 PM to 7:30 PM scheduled as a social period.
2. Meeting to be called to order at 7:30 with a technical session lasting approximately 30 minutes immediately following the introduction of attendees and the sec/tres report.
3. Business meeting.
4. Break.
5. Program with orientation towards DX and/or contests.

Members and visitors introduced themselves.

H0BH introduced the speaker for the technical session, Mr. Henry Hoffart, who presented a very informative talk on lightning characteristics and methods to protect electrical equipment from hits, including systems of grounding. A brief question and answer session followed.

The business meeting opened at 8:05 p.m.

The minutes of the fall meeting, having been published in the winter newsletter were moved accepted with no deletions or additions by H0SN, seconded by W0EJ, and passed by voice vote.

The Treasurer reported a balance of \$326.10, including \$81.00 repeater fund, as of the start of the winter EIDX meeting.

W0VX showed an ARRL 50 year DXCC sticker and presented quantity pricing.

Two members expressed interest in purchasing the stickers in quantities of 1,000. This quantity was not feasible.

W0NJK presented a report of the Repeater Committee describing the condition of the repeater PA (shown at the meeting) and describing the need for a new unit. The current status of the repeater fund was reported as \$41 collected at the last meeting plus \$40 received through the mail, giving a total of \$81. K0VN made an offer of \$69 for the old amplifier (as is). It was moved by W4NIN and seconded by W0EJ that the amplifier be deeded to K0VN as a token of appreciation for services, above and beyond,

in keeping the W0NJK reaching functioning. Approval was unanimous. The hat was passed and \$285 was collected giving the repeater fund a total of \$366. W0NJK will order a Mirage 81016 amplifier to put on-line.

W0EJ reported on the Contest Committee, outlining following contest activities and club competitions:

1. ARRL DXCC Golden Jubilee Award: H0OP had prepared a chart listing all club members and having spaces for members to write in their current DXCC country count (1987) at each meeting. Stickers in increments of 25 countries will be given qualifying members by contest committeemen W0VP and H0OP.

2. Iowa QSO Party: W0EJ moved that the EIDX sponsor an award to the Iowa club with the highest total score. After discussion, H0BH moved to table the notion. Move to table carried.

3. ARRL DX Contests (Phone & CW): The division of the club membership into 5 teams for these combined contests was explained and supplemented with a handout from the committee. Team captains were encouraged to have strategy meetings for their members and to drum up interest. Later H0SN presented charts showing how with the use of band-country multipliers, a respectable score could be accomplished with minimal effort. It was moved by W0EJ and seconded by KZ0C, to approve this proposed team competition for the two upcoming ARRL contests. Motion passed by voice vote.

4. Moved by W0EJ, seconded by H0BH, that EIDX have 2 additional informal meetings per year, one of which could be the post-contest pizza critique. Motion passed by voice vote.

A short discussion was held relative to the need to clean the meeting room. The president requested volunteers to perform duties.

W0NJK volunteered to be chairman of the banquet committee and requested assistants to help with the arrangements. W4NIN and KJ0H volunteered. A large majority of the membership expressed a desire to have a dinner meeting again this year.

K0CF reported that the QSL committee was again ready to go to press with a deadline for orders the early part of the week of 18 January. Current costs are \$34/1,000; \$20 each additional thousand.

W0VX advised that the program for the spring meeting may be a conducted tour of the Collins Radio station and that he is working out the details.

W0SR reported on DXAC activities:

1. Aruba; 8 to 8 vote by the DXAC, therefore (tie vote) no recommendation by DXAC for separate country status.

2. Tierra del Fuego and Council of Europe: No chance for country status.

3. W0SR reported lots of correspondence (ROT from EIDX members) relative to revamping DXCC with an overwhelming percentage against changes although some

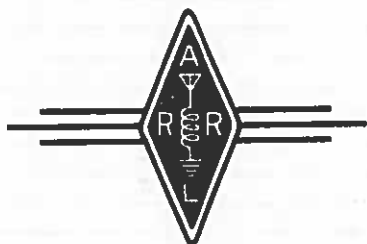

6) The Golden Jubilee certificate is available to ARRL members and nonmembers alike.

7) Applicable rules of the DXCC program, such as fair play and good sportsmanship, apply to the Golden Jubilee of DXCC Award.
