TODP reported on status of EIDXA Golden Jubilee endorsement stickers.

After a discussion of ways to improve the WOMJH repeater operation and an explanation of why the machine's squelch tail had been lengthened and them returned to its

original time, a notion to continue operation with the original parameters was made by VGEJ and seconded by LORV. Motion passed unanimously. Members reported on the repeater's performance in the Vaterloo area and Ottumwa area. LOVE reported on the new PA for the repeater. Possible uses of the \$151.88 were explored. ### HR Propagation Forecast Bulletin HR 38 ARRL Beadquarters Newington CT September 21, 1987 To all Radio Amateurs BT

After drifting lower for the past 12 days, the solar flux turned upward on September 28. Despite the low flux, most northern hemisphere DX paths were working fairly well, thanks to the more favorable position of the sux for our part of the world. This trend will be more obvious after early October and through Hovember. The improvement thus far has been most obvious on 21 mhz, but 28 mhz is doing well on transequatorial circuits. It will improve markedly in a few weeks.

The gain is nost welcome, but there will be frustrating days in the early years of the new cycle as well. Anyone who keeps a running record of propagation information broadcast at 18 minutes after each hour by WVV knows that the geomagnetic A and K indices have been peaking much higher than those for the same period last year. Rising geomagnetic activity makes for weak signals, or none at all, on communications paths in the high latitudes, such as the US east coast to northern Europe. Watch the K index information, never nore than three hours old, for rising trends. These are the bad news. Values of two and declining, point to above average conditions.

Fairly severe disturbances are likely September 22 to 24 and 27 to 28. Best days should be September 25 and 26 and September 30 to October 2. Outbreaks of new solar activity, not easily predicted, are inevitable in the rising portion of the new solar cycle. The 27 day rotational period of the sun, the main factor in nost short term propagation predictions, is not very useful this fall.

American sumspot numbers for September 18 through 15 were between 11 and 56 with a mean of 26.7

A federal judge has relied on PRB 1 to avoid a local height limitation as applied to an anateur radio antenna. Andrew B. Bodony, IZLE, had brought suit in US District Court for the eastern district of New York to overturn denial by the village of Sands Point of his application for a building permit for an 86 foot tower. retractable to 23 feet in height. In granting partial summary judgement in Bodomys favor, district judge Jacob Mishler found PRB 1 to be a proper exercise of FCC authority and found that the village was precluded from applying its 25 foot height limitation on accessory buildings to Bodomys proposed antenna. This court test of PRB 1 represents the first time a local zoning ordinance as applied to an anateur radio antenna has been declared invalid on the basis of PRB 1, and further strengthens the position of radio anateurs fighting unreasonable local ordinances AR

CHINA. BYSGA HAS BEEN OPERATING AROUND 14090 KHZ AT 8400Z WITH A GOOD SIGNAL, THOUGH 2TTY AND ANTOR OPERATING SEEN TO BE IN THE FUTURE STILL. WE HOPE FOR THE BEST.

HICARAGUA. WE HAVE A REPORT FROM HICARAGUA WHICH STATES THAT DUE TO POLITICAL PROBLEMS IN THAY COUNTRY, AND THE LACK OF MONITORING FACILITIES, IT IS HIGHLY UNLIKELY THAT THERE WILL BE ANY RITY OR ANTOR OPERATION FROM THERE FOR SOME TIME TO COME, AT LEAST UNTIL THE PRESENT SITUATION IS CLARIFIED.
