Minutes of the EIDXA meeting 5-Aug-1989

The meeting was held in conjunction with the CVARC Hamfest at the Teamsters Hall in Cedar Rapids. The meeting was called to order at 1:00 PM. There were 27 members and 7 guests present. After introductions a motion to accept the minutes of the previous meeting was moved by KØGVB and seconded by WØMJN. The motion was approved. A motion was made by W4NIM to accept the Treasurers report. The motion was seconded by KØVZR and approved.

An application for Associate membership from Rick Hadley (WAØFYG) was presented. The motion for acceptance was made by WØEJ and seconded by KZØC. The application was approved.

Announcements concerning the Peoria Hamfest, W9DXCC and 12/17 Meter contest were made by President NUØP. Secretary/Treasurer NCØO announced the vote on the new constitution. The totals were 33 in favor and 3 opposed. The required 2/3 majority of members was 30 so the new constitution was adopted.

Reports were given by WØSR on DXAC activities and prospective new countries; by WØMJN from the Repeater Committee and by NCØO on the results of the Membership Survey.

New business: WDØAWL discussed the possibility of getting T-shirts made with the club logo. A motion was introduced to pledge \$100 towards the planned Bouvet DXpedition. The funds to be collected by "passing the hat" among the members with the balance, if any, to be made up from the club general fund. The motion was seconded and, after discussion, approved by the membership.

The business meeting was adjourned at approximately 2:00 and the program followed.

Boulder and Planetary A-Indices and K-Indices -

Geomagnetic K-index values are pseudo-logarithmic numbers which are used to indicate the degree of disturbance of the geomagnetic field at a particular location. The K-index values are measured every three hours through the 24-hour day (i.e., at 0000%, 0300%, 0600%, etc.) for the immediately preceding 3 hour period. The departure (in gammas) of the most disturbed geomagnetic component (D-component or H-component) from that component's 'quiet day curve' determines the K-value. A K-value of 9 at Boulder, CO represents disturbances greater than 499 gammas, while a K-value of 9 at College, AK indicates a disturbance of greater than 2499 gammas.

To characterize the entire day, the 24-hour A-index is used, and calculated in the following way:

1) For each of the eight 3-hourly K-values for the 24-hour day, the K-value is converted to an a-factor. 2) These a-factors are added up, and divided by 8 to obtain their average value. 3) This average value is the A-index. It gives a measure of the relative geomagnetic activity for a 24-hour day.

Contesting....

The rustling of Autumn's colorful foliage, crisp clear mornings with Jack Frost dressing the pumpkin leaving the message that winter is just around the corner. To amateur radio operators, contesters in particular, it means it's time to tighten the guy wires, check those low band antennas, and most of all prepare for the season's biggest radio event, the CQ WW DX contests. Truly HF operators recognize the World Wide contest as the most prestigious and highest participated event in Ham Radio. Last year's combined event showed more than 40,000 different callsigns in the Log checkers program reaffirming the vast amount of amateur participation in the OCT-NOV contests.

The World Wide contest means different things to different operators. It can be a first taste of a page full of DX GSOs to a neophyte GRPer or the 300th country logged to a 30 year veteran DXer. Each to his own, but to a true blue eyed contester it can mean another crack at beating the 1,000,000 point total or winning that coveted certificate to reward his marathon efforts. Just participating and seeing how many GSOs or multipliers you can find is often more than reward enough for tuning the bands during the frenzied weekend of activity.

This year the EIDXA is again pushing to improve the total aggregate score for the WW contests. With a 27th place finish (about midway down the club score ladder), and finding such clubs as the Minnesota Wireless and the Kansas City Dx club finishing 20th and 22nd respectively, there is no doubt that the EIDXA could have done better. Some would say "who cares" or "they probably had bigger antennas" maybe even "they used packet and we didn't". I say "foowee"!!! Maybe we are too "lazy" or "fat catlist catching DXers" who would sooner be spectator DXers than participating operators. Is it too much to put forth a "real" effort this year in the WW? Schedule some prime time for this year's contest and be a significant part of the 1989 EIDXA WW score. Solar activity should be high with plenty of good activity and moocho fun! Enjoy!!!

EASTERN IOWA DX PACKETCLUSTER

The purpose of the Eastern Iowa DX PacketCluster is to provide timely DX information to all users as well as propagation information, current DX bulletins, the W660 GSL manager list, and other peripheral information of interest to all DXers.

The Eastern Iowa DX PacketCluster became active in early June 1989 and is located at the QTH of WØEJ and, uses that call WØEJ-1 ON 144.91 Mhz. The Eastern Iowa DX PacketCluster is controlled by a PC XT clone with a 20 Megabyte hard drive. A type 2 DRSI inboard TNC is installed inside the PC XT and drives a modified Azden PCS-4000. The PCS-4000 nominal power output is 25 watts to a Ringo Ranger at the 75 foot level. The Eastern Iowa DX PacketCluster will currently support 16 simultaneous connected stations, but the TNC will support another 16 connections when another radio is connected to the system. The Eastern Iowa DX PacketCluster can also be linked to other packet cluster systems so that information from all connected systems may be shared. This has only been accomplished once through the Eastern Iowa DX PacketCluster during a period of enhanced 2 meter propagation when linking with clusters in Chicago and Indianapolis took place.

The heart of the Eastern Iowa DX PacketCluster operation is the PacketCluster software package from Pavillion Software. A copy of all user commands is available by performing a "TYPE/FILE USERS.DOC".

The Eastern Iowa DX PacketCluster is not associated with any club, but is privately and independently supported by donations from the users. Presently, these financial supporters include WØEJ, NCØO, WBBZRL, NUØP, N4RR, and WOØV. Financial support of the Eastern Iowa DX PacketCluster is encouraged, but not solicited.

Future plans for the Eastern Iowa DX PacketCluster include providing a route to Chicago so that a reliable link with the Chicago packet cluster will be possible. This link will also provide additional links with other packet clusters in Indianapolis and, eventually, St. Louis, to name a few. As local activity warrants, another radio channel may be added to support more users.

The Eastern Iowa DX PacketCluster will be a success only if the users contribute DX information to the system. All users need to be active DXers willing to share the information they hear with others. The proposed link to Chicago will be an enhancement to the Eastern Iowa DX PacketCluster operation, but is not essential to its success. Strong local participation is, however, essential to success!

In like manner, the success of the W6GO QSL Manager List feature is strongly dependent on the strong support of local users of the Eastern Iowa DX PacketCluster. This feature is still an experiment by W6GO. This information is provided to the Eastern Iowa DX PacketCluster free of charge with the understanding that it not be copied and distributed outside of the Eastern Iowa DX PacketCluster and that the users provide updates to the list. W6GO hopes this feature will be useful of all users, but that the users will enhance the list by providing new information and will, hopefully, become bona fide subscribers to the list.

ANTENNA HINTS FROM KNBZ (from The Mad River RC Newsletter) TNX NCØD

- 1. ALWAYS use stainless steel hardware on your antennas, even if the antenna did not come with it.
- 2. ALWAYS us an "anti-seize" or "penetrox" type compound on all aluminum tubing, again, even if none came with the antenna (Electrical supply houses carry this conducting grease: it's used to prevent oxidation between aluminum & copper wires. I got "No-al-ox", another brand name, at Crescent Electric Supply Co. at 1420 Mt Vernon Rd, C.R. Ed.)
- 3. ALWAYS use Scotch-brand "88" tape. Nothing else. (And Scotch-brand "33" is not the same as "88")
- 4. ALWAYS put a rope inside aluminum beam elements to dampen vibrations caused by the wind. Use sisal or heavy nylon rope, & make sure it is free to move around inside the element.
- 5. ALWAYS use "Locktite: on ALL screws, bolts, & nuts. Basically, remember that anything that can vibrate loose, probably will, so use "locktite" on everything. Do not use bathtub caulk. (Anything which says something like: "releases harmful vapors while curing" is to be avoided. Those vapors contain acid & will literally eat hardware while keeping the weather off. Ed.)
- 6. ALWAYS clean the aluminum elements and boom with a pocketknife and/or steel wool before assembly. Never assume that the factory did this.
- 7. ALWAYS install the antenna with drain holes on the bottom side of the boom and the elements. If your antenna doesn't have them, drill some 1/16 or 1/8 inch holes, & orient them correctly during assembly.
- 8. ALWAYS assemble the antenna & then let it set a week or so...then come back & re-tighten everything, & put the sealants on. THEN put it up!
- 9. ALWAYS measure everything at least 3 times. Have someone else check your measurements.
- iØ. Antennas with insulated spacers like KLM should have the spacers locked in place with both Scotch "88" & epoxy glue. Otherwise, they'll move, & give you problems.
- 11. ALWAYS inspect everything twice before assembly. A lot of junk gets shipped these days.
- 12. NEVER be afraid to make mechanical and/or structural changes to your antennas. (BUT make sure you know what you are doing. Over-build everything, & you can't really go wrong. Ed.) It's too late to make changes when the antennas are up in the air--hopefully over 100 feet.

PRELIMINARY RESULTS OF THE EIDXA MEMBERSHIP SURVEY. de NCØO

The primary item I learned from the survey was that much more time should have been spent preparing the survey. The results, though interesting, are hard to quantify. It's amazing how different people interpret a particular question. The surveys did contain a wealth of comments and the current (and I hope future) club officers will try to use this information for planning club activities.

First only 19 responses were received out of 51 members or 37%. Probably good as surveys go but the EIDXA should do better. I also believe some bias was introduced since all respondents were full members holding DXCC. The range of country totals was from 333 (include deleted?) to 142. Another indicator that some selection went on in those that chose to respond.

Only 9 (47%) responses indicated that they also have WAZ.
