The minutes and reports were approved as printed in the newsletter. WØEJ gave a report on the packet cluster, stating that coverage now included Northern Illinois, NW Indiana, much of Wisconsin, SE Minnesota and, of course, Eastern Iowa. Possible improvements may include a high digi in Muscatine. WØSR reported on DXAC activities. He relayed that no application had been received for the Jarvis Island operation, and that they were studying applications for Penguin (ZS1) and Grosse Ile (CIØGI). Much discussion followed on how the DXAC should accept the country status of 70. WØEJ presented an 'All Quiet' report from the Iowa Section. WØMJN reported on the repeater: that KØVM had (once again) repaired the PA - the transistor overheated and unsoldered itself. announced that he would host a multi-single operation in the CQWW SSB contest in October. He firmly stated his intention to surpass that group of EIDXAers from up North (which in 1989 finished 2nd in the zero area). WØSR reported that the membership committee had reviewed two applications and recommended them to the members. KAØCWR, Mary, and NØLJO, Jeff, were unanimously approved for Associate membership. Some Near-Term goodies

MALPELO ISLAND, HKØ. HKØTU will be on the air November 3 to 8 with a team of 15 Colombian operators. They will be operating around the clock on 160 thru 10 meters, both CW and SSB. QSL via HK3DDD.

SOUTH GEORGIA, VP8. QSL manager GM4KLO says Gordon VP8CDJ, will be active from South Georgia for the next 18 months. He will be operating SSB only.

ANGOLA, D2. The rumormill has a well known European DXer going to Angola for an official visit by government invitation. If he is successful in obtaining a written authorization to transmit, expect a week of intensive CW, SSB and RTTY operation.

SAN FELIX, CEØ. Another persistant rumor has a Chilean operator going to San Felix in January, 1991, on a six month military assignment. He is said to prefer CW operation.

ROTUMA ISLAND, 3D2. Look for 3D2XV operated by VK2BCH for most of the month of October. Bing prefers SSB and Net Operations.

SAINT PAUL ISLAND, CY9. Operation by FP5DX and VE1KM is promised for October 20 to 30. All bands, both CW and SSB, with RTTY on 20 and 15 meters. Call signs requested are CY9SPI and CY9DX. QSL via FP5DX.

SIERRA LEONE, 9L. Dave, 9L1US is on 21237 KHz at 1900Z every Sunday. He will set up a schedule for a requested band and mode if you ask him nicely. Dave is planning an expedition to Guinea, 3X.

SOUTH SUDAN, STØ. Yannik, STØYD, is active on 20 meter SSB. He will also be signing STZYD from Khartoum. QSL via F6AJA.

YEMEN, 70. Club station 707AA is currently active from 0900 to 1000Z during weekends on 21335 KHz. The two YL and two OM operators hope to expand operating hours in the near future.

DL7FT says he will be active from the 'South Indian Ocean' Sept 28 to Oct 8. QSL direct only to his home call.

TOKELAU, ZK3. Kiyoko will, depending on transportation, depart for the Tokelau Islands on September 25 or 28. She expects to be active for about a month. Next stop -- Tarawa (T30).

The initial reaction to the announcement of fees for the DXCC program brought howls from the DX community. We were assured however that the DXers were not being singled out for 'special' treatment. Further research shows that we may have indeed been singled out.

A phone call to Newington informed me that the decision to charge a fee had been published with the minutes of the Jan 90 Board meeting. No matter how many times I reread those minutes, I could find no mention, other than the approval of a budget for 1990. I did spot a box that offered individual committee reports for the cost of reproduction and mailing. Here is what I found.

From the minutes of the November 17-18, 1989 meeting of the ARRL Board of Directors Administration & Finance Committee. Committee members present were Chairman Ed Metzger, W9PRN, Clyde Hurlbert, W5CH, Fried Heyn, WA6WZO, James McCobb, K1LLU, Joel Harrison, WB5IGF, and EVP David Sumner, K1ZZ.

- 8) The committee was disturbed that it had been presented a budget that balanced only with a dues increase. The committee unanimously instructed Mr. Sumner to revise the proposed 1990 budget; excluding the incorporation of a dues increase, which would reflect a balance between revenue and expenses. The committee recessed at 11:00 AM to permit Mr. Sumner's revision.
- 9) The committee reconvened at 12:45 PM and discussed Mr. Sumner's revision. On motion of Mr. Hurlbert, second by Mr. Metzger, the 1990 proposed budget was approved, by a vote of 3 in favor to 1 abstaining, as amended by the following:
 - a. Reduce QST publication expense by approximately \$40,000.
 - b. Reduce QST forwarding expense by approximately \$5,000.
 - c. Eliminate "additional IS staff" from IARU support budget.
 This saves \$48,750 in salaries, \$10,725 in fringes, \$500
 in training, and \$9,000 in relocation and interview
 expense. Total savings \$68,975.
 - d. Cut "influencing WARC 92 agenda" by 50% in IARU support budget (travel overseas). Reason: opportunity to spend the funds for this objective probably will not develop. Total savings \$8,250.
 - e. Cut "contingencies" by 50% in IARU support budget (travel overseas). Reason: use of funds not defined Total savings \$3,500.
 - f. Eliminate Awards Assistant, QSL Bureau Assistant, and DXCC data entry clerk positions presently unfilled. Result: continuing backlog in these service areas. Total savings \$44,631.
 - 9. Reduce travel member contact budget by 20%.

 Total savings \$5,600.
 - h. Eliminate public relations consultant. Total savings \$36,000.
 - i. Eliminate public relations ad expense (promotional videotape). Total savings \$15,000.

- j. Reduce membership promotional mailings from 30,000 to 20,000 per month, and make other reductions in printing and postage budgets. Total savings \$30,000.
- k. Reduce provision for depreciation (the result of reducing the capital budget). Total savings \$8,000.
- 1. Payroll \$36,000.
- m. Create DXCC AWARDS FEES as a source of new revenue and to reduce volume of DXCC applications, particularly from overseas. Total approximate revenue \$30,000.
- n. 800 telemarketing activity is deferred. Total savings \$69,048.

10) After completion of the above, the committee was satisfied that staff had exhibited sufficient fiscal responsibility, and was prepared to discuss a membership dues increase. The committee concluded the next few years will place an additional strain on the League's financial resources while a 220 MHz court battle proceeds, preparation for WARC in 1992 begins and is followed through, and establishment of government relations continues. After a very lengthy discussion, the committee unanimously directed the following resolution be submitted to the board at the 1990 Annual meeting in January: (text of the resolution, which appeared in QST, announcing a dues increase, followed. ed.)

Thats it folks, that is where the fees came from.

The slashing that comes with budget balancing is something that we have come to accept. That any thought would be given to what is being cut is maybe too much to expect, especially when it was done in something less than 2 hours. The DXers seem to have take several shots here, losing a bureau (outgoing? — we just took a fee hike there) person, losing an data entry person at the DXCC desk, and being asked to be the first (only??) activity to pay its own way when asking for League services.

I remember being assured that the fee was for 'expedient services' for the DXCC submitters. It looks to me like they were used to balance the budget (on paper at least). Now that the budget is balanced, and increased dues are in effect, I am looking forward to seeing where our fees are going to be used. Just replacing the deleted data entry position is not sufficient. It must be filled and (at least) another created and filled.

I am at a loss to know why the Committee was so specific about "reduc(ing) volume particularly from overseas." The fee schedule (which by-the-way is not specified in the budget) will surely induce the stateside DXers to submit only once a year. Are we going to chase away the foreign DXCCers with a \$10 (or more) fee for each submission? If so, will enough of them drop the program, that the DX-peditions will drop off significantly? With a devious enough mind, one could read into this whole exercise an attempt to drive off the DXers a bit further, and eventually kill the DXCC program.

Several of our members have recently upgraded their licenses. Chuck, WBØZKG, aced his 13 wpm test for a General ticket. Mary, KAØCWR, (her OM is WBØZKG) has gone from Novice to Tech, to General, and has a 20 wpm certificate in hand. Jeff, NØLJO, exchanged his advanced ticket for an Extra. Toledo seems to be a hotbed of activity these days. Congratulations to each of you.

KØJGH has gracefully assumed the job of Net Controll and calls the EIDXA net each Sunday evening at 2130 local time. The frequency is 3780 +/- QRM. The net is about the only opportunity to chat with the folks in Burlington, Mason City, and other distant sites. A few of those not able to transmit on 3780 do check in via the repeater. We look forward to hearing each of you check in.

Last year during the CGWW SSB contest, we sponsored a DX HOG competition which drew a number of entries. Enough people entered that we thought we would do it again. The idea is to work as many DXpedition stations working the contest on as many bands as you can. Last years winner was KØGT. with about 50 band stations. As we did last year, a sheet will be handed out at the meeting listing the counting stations. If you cannot be at the meeting, but want to participate, get ahold of WBBZRL via the repeater, packet cluster, WAØRJT-1 BBS, the EIDXA net, or the landline. I will send you a copy.

Congratulations to the newest EIDXA members, NØLJO and KAØCWR. Both are closing-in on their 100th QSL card.
