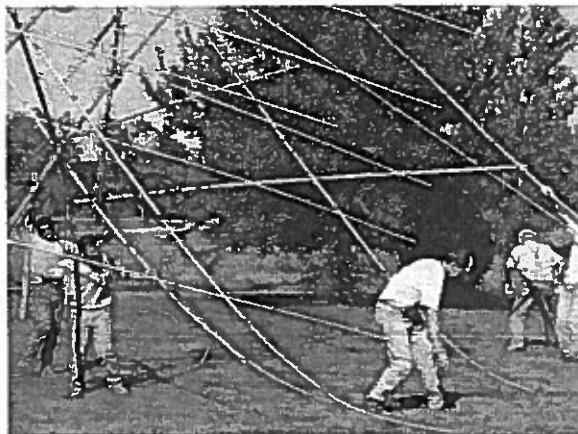
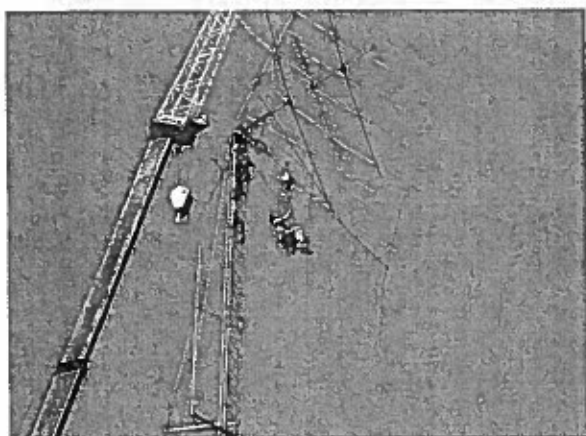
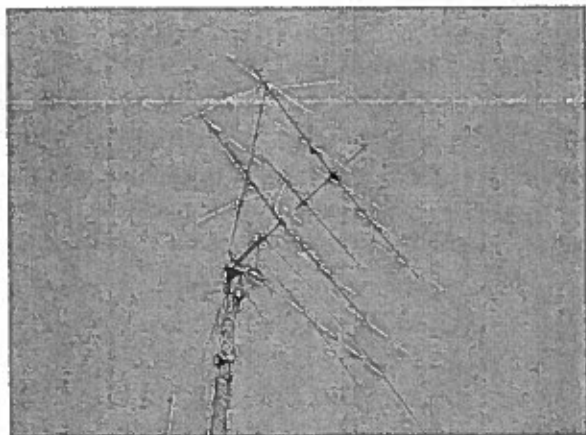

EIDXA Club Badges

It has been a few years since we placed a badge order for members. Our previous badge provider appears to have fallen to poor health and is no longer able to produce our badge dies and do the engraving.

While at Dayton we talked to the SignMan from Baton Rouge. Rick has agreed to work with the club to produce a club logo backing and do a standard

engraving package. The details are based on the existing EIDXA badge from the previous producer.

There's a one-time \$25 die charge to make the metal die. If the initial order is for 10 or more badges, the die fee will be waived. Please allow ~2-3 weeks for the die making process.

A 4-line badge is \$7.50 and includes a locking safety pin fastener. (Members may choose their preferred fastener.) Shipping & handling is \$1.25 per badge if he mails each badge directly to the member or \$6 for 5 or more badges delivered to a single address.

Once we have the badge design finalized, we can add the EIDXA to the SignMan's - "Clubs & Organizations" section of his web site (www.thesignman.com/clubs/others.html). This will provide the necessary reference for future badge orders.

I'm always looking for ideas and inputs for the newsletter. If you have something that you would like to include, please get a copy to me via any of the traditional methods. (e-mail, US Postal, etc.)

Remember, this is your newsletter!!

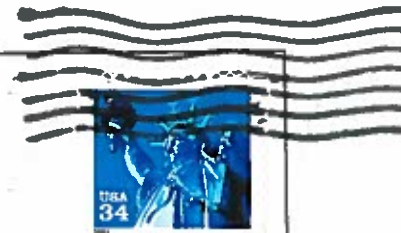
Meeting Notice
